FAQ for Parents:

Vaping and Fentanyl Education is presented by Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Services and is an interactive program that travels to community schools to provide information about the dangers of vaping and fentanyl. The Watch UR BAC program is recognized by TEA as a resource to educate students, faculty, parents, and communities on the dangers of vaping and fentanyl and meets the curriculum/instruction content requirements of TEC §38.040. The curriculum is age/audience appropriate is presented for all grade levels, and targets junior high and high school students. CCISD students in 5th-12th grades will receive Vaping and Fentanyl Education.

The program outline is as follows:

1. Teen-impaired driving which includes alcohol and drugs
 - a. Alcohol poisoning
 - b. 911 Lifeline law
2. Health education that includes information about substance use and abuse
3. Prevention of the abuse and addiction to fentanyl
 - a. Hunter's Law
 - b. Texas House Bill 3908
 - c. Narcan education
4. Health education that includes information about Vaping
 - a. House Bill 114
5. Suicide prevention
 - a. Teen depression, grief, and choices that might lead to drugs and suicide.
 - b. making good, healthy choices
6. Awareness of local school and community resources

Why is my child's school participating in this program?

Texas HB 3908 requires fentanyl and drug abuse prevention instruction in Texas public schools for grades six through 12

Who is working with my child?
